Digital Inclusion

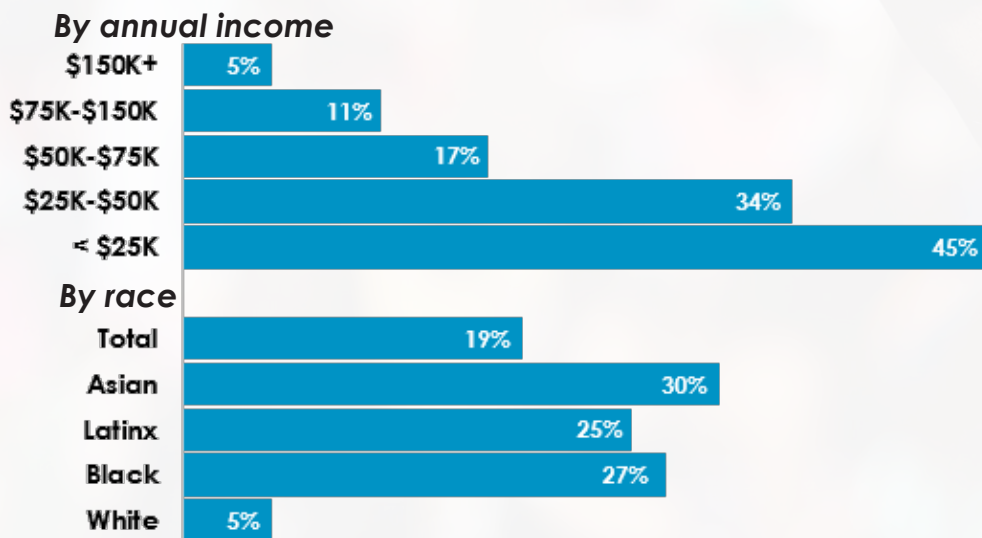
